



DEAR COLLEAGUES AND FRIENDS:

Throughout my time leading NYU Langone Dental Medicine and especially during the last year of the unfolding COVID-19 pandemic, I have directly communicated with you about the severe concerns we face as a community of healthcare providers along with the hope engendered by scientific and medical developments in prevention and treatment for this unprecedented global challenge. As we enter a new year and hold our second consecutive virtual Faculty Development meeting, I am optimistic about our capacity to adapt to an uncertain healthcare

landscape, where emphasis is now rightly placed on supporting our healthcare workers during this record viral surge. I remain confident that evidence-based prevention strategies (e.g., vaccinations including boosters, masking, and social distancing) and authorized treatments (e.g., antiviral pills and monoclonal antibodies) will save lives, permit our economy to rebound, and enable limited social gatherings to proceed with caution. While the novel coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 may never be eradicated, it may soon become endemic.

We are entering a new phase of the COVID-19 pandemic where infections from highly transmissible variants will be relatively mild for most people who are vaccinated with boosters, while unvaccinated and vulnerable populations may face severe illnesses that will continue to stress our healthcare systems and colleagues.

It is therefore remarkable, but not surprising, that NYU Langone Dental Medicine continues to evolve to meet the demands and embrace the opportunities of this new era. As a healthcare system leader with an enduring interest in and responsibility for promoting integrated care, the following collaborative achievements of the past year resonated with me for special distinction.

 The conversion of the Department of Dental Medicine to Wisdom, the dental electronic health record module of Epic, that combines the medical and dental information for each patient into a single record to improve continuity of care and strengthen dental resident education and training.

- The advent of screening and referral by dentists for the social determinants of health in the dental clinics of Family Health Centers at NYU Langone as part of the Advanced Education in Pediatric Dentistry (AEPD) Program to support the health and well-being of patients and their families and enhance the clinical experiences of dental faculty, residents, and staff in interprofessional communication and collaborative care.
- The expansion of the General Practice Residency (GPR) Program to NYU Langone Hospital—Long Island, with 9 additional PGY-1 positions and 2 additional PGY-2 positions available for GPR residents who will engage in 2-week rotations in internal medicine, anesthesiology, and emergency medicine.

This issue of *The Bridge* shines a spotlight on 4 health centers in diverse communities across the United States that train NYU Langone Dental Medicine residents, notably those in the Advanced Education in General Dentistry (AEGD) and the Advanced Education in Pediatric Dentistry (AEPD) Programs: Albany Area Primary Health Care, Inc. in Albany, GA; Columbia Basin Health Association in eastern WA; Family Health Centers at NYU Langone in Brooklyn, NY; and Suncoast Community Health Centers, Inc. in Brandon, FL. These and other health centers that serve as the primary training sites for our 400+ dental residents were severely tested during the initial stage of the COVID-19 pandemic


when dental services were closed for all but emergency visits. Most sites have since recovered their patient volumes and adapted their practices with upgraded filtration systems, heightened infection control policies and procedures, and provisional or expanded telehealth services. Dental residents learned under duress to provide compassionate care for their patients and one another, and upon graduation, several were hired at the health centers where they trained.

In the face of profound loss including more than 800,000 deaths from COVID-19 in the United States alone and unprecedented viral case counts and provider, and staff shortages at the time of this writing, we collectively uphold and live out our trifold mission: to serve, to teach, and to discover through an integrated academic culture devoted to excellence in patient care, education, and research. I remain grateful and impressed by the dedication of all of you who contribute your talents, skills, and humanity to achieve a more equitable future for everyone.







HEALTH CENTER SPOTLIGHT

Increasing Access to Care

Albany Area Primary Health Care, Inc. serving Southwest Georgia

Albany Area Primary Health Care, Inc. (AAPHC) has been able to increase access to dental care, in large part, because of its affiliation with NYU Langone Dental Medicine Postdoctoral Residency Programs. The site is in its second year, hosting two Advanced Education in General Dentistry (AEGD) residents. Clinic productivity has increased by 300-400 patient encounters monthly compared to visits prior to the start of the residency program.

In addition to treating patients clinically, residents have helped to educate the patient population on the importance of oral healthcare.

AAPHC is one of the largest practice groups in Albany, GA providing high quality health care to a diverse patient population, including underserved children and adults across 9 Southwest Georgia counties. Residents have a unique opportunity to treat HIV/AIDS patients, experience that is not available at all residency training sites.

During the pandemic, the marketing team has focused its efforts on educating patients, specifically, helping community members not feel fearful of coming into the office. The organization is

committed to the integration of care—emphasizing the integration of primary care and oral healthcare. Nursing staff are being trained on caries risk assessment and being taught how to apply fluoride varnish. They then encourage patients to visit a dentist. NYU Langone Dental Medicine residents receive these referrals in addition to referrals from a clinic participating in the Oral Health & Diabetes Collaborative, part of the National Network of Oral Health Access (NNOHA).

Dr. Tiara Marshall, a 2021 graduate of the program, was recently hired as faculty to work with NYU Langone Dental Medicine residents at the AAPHC site. During her residency, she said, "the thing I like the most about AAPHC is that we are all treated equally and we have access to our dental director 100% of the time, to ask questions or receive additional help."

HEALTH CENTER SPOTLIGHT

Caring for Their Community

Columbia Basin Health Association serving Eastern Washington



Columbia Basin Health Association (CBHA) is located in the heart of Eastern Washington. They have three clinics to treat migrant seasonal farm workers and their families in three counties. CBHA provides a full spectrum of dental services including surgical extractions, root canal therapies, retreatment of failed endodontics, implant placement and restoration, complete and partial dentures, and orthodontic treatment for children.

The organization has always placed emphasis on employee and patient safety. When COVID-19 hit, they reacted quickly to outfit all patient rooms to negative pressure rooms; practitioners were fitted for N95 masks or respirators. They were also able to collaborate with another health center nearby to help manage emergency cases. While CBHA did not close their doors during the pandemic, they did see a decrease of nearly 10,000 patient encounters over the last year.

Despite decreased services and patient visits, the organization has continued to employ all of its providers and has hired more dental hygienists to work in the clinics. Administration allowed staff to work from home when conditions did not allow them to come into the office, in order to keep everyone employed.

Telehealth services were something that was in the works pre-COVID. During the pandemic, they were able to launch two telehealth programs to reach more patients in the community. Family Oral Health Education (FOHE) allows medical providers to conduct dental screenings and educate mother and child in the medical setting. Dental hygienists sit in on well child visits, for children 6 and under, to answer questions and encourage families to follow-up with a dental provider. CBHA also created oral health educational videos that were

shared during and after medical appointments. CBHA created these videos and applied it to telehealth dental visit for all FOHE soon after the pandemic started.

The second telehealth program focused on pregnant woman. At the time of their OB visits, oral health information and videos were shared to educate expectant mothers on the importance of oral health during and after pregnancy. Videos and brochures are in both English and Spanish as 55% of CBHA's population only speak Spanish.

During the peak of COVID, some of these telehealth services were reimbursable, helping to bring in additional revenue to offset the decreased number of patient encounters when the clinic had to limit services. While no longer being reimbursed by the state, today, the organization is continuing to provide these services because they have seen the significant impact on the community.

When asked, "What have you learned over the past 18 months," Dr. Ji Choi, Dental Director said, "We've learned we can effectively keep COVID out of the clinic. There has been a 0% transmission rate from patient to staff and staff to patient. While wearing all the additional PPE is still cumbersome and sometimes hot and uncomfortable, it is effective. Second, we have

learned that people are resilient. Our dental providers and staff have provided compassionate care for our patients, our community, and one another. Lastly, I am most proud to share that we have hired a recent AEGD Program graduate, Dr. Richard Jimenez, to work in one of our clinics. One of the primary goals of establishing an AEGD residency program was to train the next generation of public health/community dental practitioners who might stay to work in the region. I'm delighted to have achieved this goal."



HEALTH CENTER SPOTLIGHT

Building Immunity for the Community

Suncoast Community Health Centers serving Central Gulf Coast Region of Florida

The Brandon Community Health Center of Suncoast Community Health Centers, Inc. in Brandon, Florida never closed its doors during the COVID-19 pandemic. For a six-week period, they were only open for emergency cases, but in May 2021 the health center reopened to treat non-emergency patients, prior to the start of the residency program.

Dr. Priyanka Iyer, Associate
Director of the NYU Langone Dental
Medicine Advanced Education
in Pediatric Dentistry Program at
Suncoast CHC credits the health center
administration and leadership team
for being able to return to work so
quickly. During the break, the health
center installed a new, top-of-the-line
filtration system, purchased ionizing
devices to disinfect every room,
and stock piled personal protective
equipment (PPE) in order to ensure
the safety of its practitioners and staff.

Additionally, a third party company was hired to fit-test masks for all faculty, staff, and residents. Employees of the health center were some of the first in the state to be vaccinated.

The site has been successful in increasing access to care during the pandemic, in part, because of their



proactive approach in managing patient visits. The health center has been diligent in following infection control policies and procedures to ensure the safety of all its constituents. The high volume of patient encounters has resulted in residents completing their requirements ahead of schedule. Additionally, a third hospital completed credentialing for residents to treat patients in the operating room. Residents now see OR patients at Tampa General Hospital, South Florida Baptist Hospital, and Brandon Regional Hospital.

While they have not needed to provide telehealth services, all residents have been trained on a new system created during the pandemic, so residents and staff are ready to go should services be required.

All of these practices have helped to "build immunity for the community," a slogan created by Dr. Iyer.

Dr. Iyer spoke candidly about changes over the last 18 months. "Faculty, residents, and staff have grown in new ways during the pandemic. We all were put in uncomfortable situations and had to learn to adapt. In some ways, it has been good for the residents to deal with families under stress and financial strains. They have become more resilient and compassionate practitioners."

Dental School Health Program

hen asked about the department progress and experience over the past year, Dr. Margaret Mason, Vice President and Senior Administrator noted, "we are much further along than we have been since October of last year amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. Although still facing challenges, we are currently at 100% capacity from where we were when COVID-19 pandemic began its impact. We are still working with patients who are not able to leave their homes via tele-dentistry to screen and provide information about preventive care for themselves and their children. During our closure, we were working with access points by the children's locations to visit the closest family health center site, which resulted in only about 30% of the children in our program that actually

sought care. Currently our Dental School Health Program has started up again as of this September school year. We are at about 50% of what we have been in the past. It has been a hurdle because most of our schools are elementary and since those children are not vaccinated, it's been a struggle to really get them back into care. We are hoping in the next couple of months there will be changes there."

Transition to EPIC's Wisdom System

NYU Langone Dental Medicine recently migrated to EPIC's Wisdom System. Wisdom is a new dental product for the Epic System we use at NYU Langone Health. Epic is one of the largest medical record systems in the country; it is used in most hospitals and is known for its efficiency in guiding patient care based on patient

conditions. Wisdom was rolled out to our facilities on November 1, 2021. The goal behind this system is to have one integrated record that can serve patients. All information that dentists enter can be seen by medical physicians and all information that physicians enter can be seen by us, leading to an advancement in the education form. Dental residents treating patients will now have the capability of looking at medication reconciliation, patient conditions, and all recent and future visits. It will also provide the resident with a higher quality of education because there will be a collaborative approach to teaching. We hope that through dental being integrated into the system we can have a better record that's more comprehensive to the patients' needs whether it's medical, mental health issues or dental. Referrals will now give us ease with all dentists being

in one system and immediately picking up referrals. Patients will have access to their entire dental records by going into the MyChart application, where they can also make and cancel appointments with ease. If they do not have a computer at home, they can always download the MyChart app onto their smartphone for easy access.


Workforce Development Project

The Workforce Development Project is a project that was funded by the federal government through the Cares Act. This project has given our community health centers a way to move people out of poverty by giving us the opportunity to provide them with technical training. It allows us to hire people who have no experience as a dental assistant and put them through a year-long training program to teach them how to technically



be a dental assistant. Once they are ready to graduate, we look to collaborate with partner facilities. We see this as a way to get them out of poverty by providing a career and greater access from a pipeline standpoint of auxiliary staff. Our residents can also now work in four-handed dentistry in even more time than they are currently doing since they will have a chair side dental

assistant with them most of the time. We feel our commitment to public health is important for our residents to see that we look for our neighbors; that we try to bring all people into a state where they can develop and grow. It's the fundamental resource of human rights. Residents will now give job opportunities to people in their community so they can serve and have them learn and create as well.

Meet the NYU Langone Hospital-Long Island GPR Program Team

n July 2021, NYU Langone
Hospital–Long Island's General
Practice Residency (GPR) Program
became part of NYU Langone Dental
Medicine. Dr. Babak Bina, General
Practice Residency Program Director
for the Brooklyn site now oversees both
locations.

The merger of NYU Winthrop
Hospital with NYU Langone Health
solidifies the hospital's full integration
into one of the country's premier
healthcare systems. In a press release
published November 9, 2020, NYU
Langone Health's NewsHub noted, NYU
Winthrop Hospital will change its name
to NYU Langone Hospital-Long Island
continuing to foster its rich traditions
of providing first-rate healthcare to
local Long Island communities, while
leveraging NYU Langone's strengths to

ensure delivery of world-class services in every specialty.

The GPR Program at NYU Langone Hospital-Long Island has nine positions available for one-year of postgraduate education and training. Residents treat children and adults with complex medical/special needs. They complete three rotations during residency spending two weeks in Internal Medicine, Anesthesiology, and the emergency room. GPR residents are also exposed to a simulation center in the hospital's Research and Academic Center. Simulation enhances the educational offerings by providing an experiential learning environment where dental residents can practice a variety of technical and behavioral skills.




We have not let the past dictate who we are, but will use it to determine who we will become; better and stronger.



We cultivate diversity and inclusion among students, faculty, staff, and leadership.

Walter Parrish and Dr. Christian Torres answer questions and provide insight from the Office of Diversity Affairs

What is the role of the Office of Diversity Affairs?

he Office of Diversity Affairs' mission is to "cultivate a diverse and inclusive environment", and we accomplish this through our curriculum within medical education, training and professional development

of residents and faculty, and collaboration on best practices to ensure that we attract, onboard, and retain diverse talent. We support the NYU Grossman School of Medicine across the medical education continuum, as well as faculty recruitment and retention. The Office of Diversity Affairs,

also known as ODA, also works with offices in the education mission, clinical departments, and collaborates with diversity partners across NYU Langone Health. It sounds lofty, but the immense challenges we face in medicine need even bigger aspirations to overcome them.

How does the NYU Langone culture value and embrace the uniqueness of others?

It's nearly impossible to live and work in New York City without recognizing the value of diversity. We serve people from all over the city, country, and world, and we know from research that the best care is achieved when we reflect and represent our community. Similarly, bringing together people from an array of backgrounds yields a plethora of ideas, and we know that is key to improvement and innovation.

The Workplace Culture and Inclusion (WCI) team within Human Resources. led by Molree Williams-Lendor, JD, has begun to help staff create Employee Resource Groups that allow folks to network, collaborate, enhance professional development, and bring awareness to cultural groups. Additionally, we work with WCI to host programs that commemorate heritage months and other initiatives that bring awareness and seeks to enhance the cultural competency of learners and employees. The LGBTQ Council is also a strong network of professionals that is open to anyone in the community. And lastly, Human Resources has developed inclusive policies and practices related to gender transition, names, and pronouns.

What kinds of leadership efforts are being undertaken to encourage a commitment to excellence through diversity?

We have several ongoing efforts. Our largest right now is one of our partners, the Institute for Excellence in Health Equity, led by **Dr. Gbenga Ogedegbe**. The Institute will not only support health equity research, but also attract and develop diverse faculty and staff. In collaboration with the Institute, NYU Langone department chairs have established vice and associate chairs for diversity and health equity within select departments, which will bolster the work being done within each field. Lastly, we're now in the second year of our Faculty

Leadership Development Program, which is dedicated to elevating junior faculty from underrepresented groups.

What recruitment sources and strategies have you found are most effective at attracting diverse resident and faculty candidates?

Aside from those leadership efforts, it's really the people of NYU Langone who make the best case for coming here. We often see in residency recruitment, for example, that the people with whom applicants want to speak to the most are also our greatest advocates: the current residents themselves. The same happens at the faculty level. We continue to make strides in representation, and with that comes more voices who can truly speak to our culture of inclusion.

We're also developing a training on holistic review within admissions. The American Association of Medical Colleges (AAMC) has been committed to holistic review and encourages all institutions to think intentionally about the applicant as a whole. ADEA also supports this movement and has developed its own definition and workshops for holistic review that programs and institutions can utilize.

How do residents and faculty communicate concerns in a safe, confidential way?

Individual program and department leadership each have their own processes for residents and faculty to share their concerns when it comes to discrimination and other issues. Our partners in NYU Langone's Human Resource office are also available, particularly when these issues cross into legal territory. Our office mainly serves as another way for individuals to connect with these resources, or for more general, emotional support.

Many do not know that you started as a resident, what year did you start your residency?

Dr. D'Emilio: I started as a PGY-1 in July of 1991 and then 2nd year as Chief Resident in 1992. In 1993, I stayed on as an attending at the Sunset Park main site and in addition, I worked as a Program Coordinator for the AEGD Program assisting the Director.

Dr. Mason: I started my GPR residency in 2001 and was the second year I was the chief resident. I was originally going to go into private practice part time in New Jersey and work at Lutheran Medical Center part time at the Park slope clinic. The operations director at the time had to go on medical leave and asked me to fill in for her. The rest is history, I've been here ever since.

What are some of the accomplishments that you had as Program Director for the AEGD program?

Dr. D'Emilio: I became [Program] Director in April of 1996, I continued with the expansion in Metro and Upstate NY. That same year was the first expansion out of NY into Arizona.

What are some of the accomplishments that you are most proud of? What do you attribute this success to?

Dr. Mason: I'm most proud of bringing in highly competent providers who treat our patients with the high quality equitable care. It's a pleasure to watch residents learn and grow in a community health environment. It means a lot. I see the value in others and that has helped build an incredible team so that the work can continue.

From 24 Residents to 236 residents is an incredible accomplishment. What do you attribute this success to?

Dr. D'Emilio: The motivating factor is accredited to Dr. Neal Demby's vision and wanting to expand this program across the country and even globally. His passion was to expand our outreach to areas to increase access to oral healthcare for the vulnerable underserved populations and to increase manpower in shortage areas. The prime way to accomplish this was to place residents in Community Health Centers throughout the Country. Dr. Demby was the motivating factor behind all of that, inspiring all of us to reach out to Health Centers and attend dental organizational meetings to connect with potential partners and sites.

Dr. Margaret K. Mason and her 20 year journey from Resident to Vice President and Senior Administrator

The pride you take in your work inspires us all to work harder and do better.

While serving as Program Director (Dr. D'Emilio) / Senior Administrator (Dr. Mason) you have also accomplished many things in addition to your work with the organization. What are some of the accolades that you are most proud of?

Dr. D'Emilio: I received my Master in Arts in Dental Education in 2017. In 2018 I became fellow into the Pierre Fauchard Academy. In 2021, I became a fellow with the International College of Dentists. In 2011, I received the Faculty of the year award and The Outstanding Leadership Award. In 2012 at NNOHA, I received the Outstanding Leadership Award.

Dr. Mason: The accolades I am most proud of are graduating from the NYU Lutheran Dental Medicine's General Practice Residency Training Program; holding a Bachelor of Arts in Biology from Rutgers University; a Doctorate of Dental Medicine from the University of Pennsylvania; School of Dental Medicine and a Master of Education from the University of Pacific; Benerd School of Education and I am currently a MBA candidate at Johns Hopkins Carey Business School.

What would you tell your younger self? Straight out of Dental School, coming into residency, would you do it the same or would you do it differently?

Dr. D'Emilio: I always say this now "The best laid plans are unplanned." I say that because when I came out of Dental School and went into the Program I did it for a specific reason. I had a specific goal. I was going to go into to a private practice with my own dentist. I needed to train to become better skilled and more confident, as well as learn more advanced procedures and techniques. I was getting great education and mentorship by my faculty at the time. I realized that if I did not do the year of training going into private practice would be a disservice to patients. That whole year opened up my eyes to public health dentistry. I just loved community dentistry and giving back to people who needed the care.

Dr. Mason: I would have listened a little more to my attendings and asked more for their advice. I would do it the same, but I would have been more interested in the relationships as a way of growth in the field.

When you look back at your 25 (Dr. D'Emilio) /20 years (Dr. Mason), what are you most proud of?

Dr. D'Emilio: I am the most proud of the people who believed, inspired, and supported me. Without them, this wouldn't mean anything.

Dr. Mason: Serving patients as if they were one of my family. I've always had the restlessness to want to improve care and do more for our patients.

ACCREDITATION

COMMISSION ON DENTAL ACCREDITATION

The Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) employs a nationwide collaborative peer-review accreditation process to evaluate the quality of dental education programs. Every seven (7) years, CODA visits the institution's clinical training sites to verify that the programs meet accreditation standards. Additionally, when new clinical sites are approved, a special-focused site visit is scheduled before the graduation of the first class of residents.

NYU Langone Dental Medicine Residency Postdoctoral Residency Programs comprise five programs – AEGD, Endodontics, Dental Anesthesiology, GPR, and Pediatric Dentistry; they are all accredited and follow this process.

AEGD, Pediatric Dentistry, Endodontics, and Dental Anesthesiology each have a model of one Program Director with affiliated off-campus clinical training sites. AEGD has 38 regions throughout the United States consisting of one to fourteen clinical training sites. Pediatric Dentistry has fifteen regions, each with one to two clinical training sites, several hospital affiliations, and pediatric medicine rotations for required offservice rotations. Endodontics has its institutionbased program in Brooklyn and an affiliated off-campus clinical site in Puerto Rico. Dental Anesthesiology is primarily based in Brooklyn but has affiliated clinical rotations in Arizona and California. The GPR program has two institutionbased clinical training sites.

THE NYU LANGONE HOSPITALS ACCREDITATION PROCESS

Two months before a scheduled CODA site visit, each postgraduate program submits a selfstudy guide that is a comprehensive self-analysis detailing the program's resources, curriculum, policies, and operational standards. A CODA team consisting of two independent CODA consultants, reviews the written and on-site documentation. The team conducts interviews with administrators, instructors, and residents to verify the information in the self-study guide, and to ensure that the program meets accreditation standards. The Commission meets in the Summer and Winter of each year to review all site visit reports. The results of each Commission meeting are sent to the Dean, Vice-President of Graduate Dental Education, and the Program Director.

Due to the nationwide locations of the clinical training sites, AEGD and Pediatric Dentistry visits are scheduled by states or regions. Each year, AEGD has five to six comprehensive site visits and multiple special-focused site visits for the newly approved clinical training sites. Pediatric Dentistry has one to two comprehensive site visits and one to two special-focused site visits annually. The other programs have a site visit approximately every seven years.

The pandemic created new challenges. All site visits were postponed for one year. In 2021 and into the foreseeable future, CODA developed a policy to allow site visits to be conducted virtually or as a hybrid to accommodate the clinical site's visitor policies and the CODA reviewer team preferences. NYU Langone Dental Medicine's Accreditation Team has prepared for every situation that may occur. A virtual visit means all participants are virtual, and presentations, interviews, and the video tour of the clinical training sites are conducted via Zoom. If the site visit is virtual, the US Department of Education requires an additional on-site visit within 18 months. If the site visit is hybrid, one or both CODA reviewer team members are on-site, while other participants can elect to be on-site or virtual. As with the virtual site visit, presentations, interviews, and the video tour of the clinical training sites are conducted via Zoom; however, since the on-site reviewer can attend a live tour of the facilities, hybrid visits are considered complete.

IN MEMORIAM

Dr. Gregory Carter LaChance

1953 - 2021



e are deeply saddened by the passing of **Dr. Gregory LaChance** on February 1, 2021. Dr. LaChance graduated from Georgetown University School of Dentistry. Through the National Health Service Corps, he was hired by the El Rio Community Health Center in Tucson, Arizona where he practiced community-based dentistry for 40 years.

In 1996, he was instrumental in pioneering the expansion of the Advanced Education in General Dentistry residency program out of New York and into Arizona. Aligned with the AEGD program's service-learning mission, El Rio CHC became one of the first clinical training sites in Arizona to affiliate with our organization, then known as Lutheran Medical Center and train AEGD residents. He later helped to establish our Advanced Education in Pediatric Dentistry residency program at El Rio CHC.

As El Rio's Dental Director, he oversaw the growth of the department from one dental site to seven dental sites with over 50,000 annual visits. His steadfast leadership was an inspiration furthering the cause of community based dentistry and equity and quality of care for all. He impacted the lives of countless patients throughout Arizona and dental professionals across the country.

In 2020, Dr. LaChance retired from El Rio CHC and stepped down as Dental Director of the NYU Langone Dental Medicine AEGD Program. His legacy lives on with his colleagues who continue to train AEGD and Pediatric Dentistry residents. "He will be forever remembered for his dedication, service, compassion, and collaboration."

CE CREDIT COURSES FOR FACULTY

CE CREDIT WORKSHOPS FOR FACULTY

In January 2021, GDE offered a 5.5 CE credit workshop had been offered titled "Foundational Motivational Interviewing (MI) Training Workshop", presented by Franze de la Calle, MS, RDN. MI is one method of client-centered communication that is designed to motivate people for change by helping them recognize and resolve the discrepancy between their present behavior, and their future personal goals and values. This counseling approach suggests that for change in behavior to occur, the person must feel convinced that the change will improve their well-being, and confident in making the change. In other words, the person must be self-efficacious about their ability to make the change. The foundational workshops focused mainly on acquisition of basic MI skills. Participants received an overview of the principles and foundational MI techniques (e.g., asking open-ended questions, affirmations, reflections, and summaries) and problem-solving approaches.

In May 2021, GDE offered a CE for General Practice Residency (GPR) Alumni titled "Digital Dentistry: CAD/CAM Technology & 3D Printing", presented by **Alex Parshin, DMD**. This course introduced participants to digital dentistry by showing how CAD/CAM technology and 3D printing is being utilized in the dental office. Goals and objectives of this course included: 1) How to utilize digital dentistry in your practice, 2) Treatment plan cases using 3D technology, 3) Create efficient digital workflows for every day dentistry, 4) Increase case acceptance, 5) Improve patient care, 6) Learn the benefits of using 3D technology.

On October 21, 2021 GDE offered a CE for AEGD (Advance Education in General Dentistry titled "Clinical Review of Dental Patients Who Use Marijuana & Cannabinoids" by **Dr. Eric S. Bornstein**. The objectives of the course included: 1) Describe the major physiologic effects of THC, 2) List the most commonly seen adverse effects of THC in dental patients, 3) Outline the concerns and complications of cannabis use in older patients, 4) Summarize the oral and dental complications related to cannabis use, 5) Describe the major adverse drug interactions associated with high potency marijuana, 6) Outline the principal medications used in the pharmacologic management of THC side effects.

In October 2021, a two-part, 5 CE credit Pediatric Dentistry
Leadership course titled "Organizational Structure, Culture, and
Growth with Application to the Real World; A Model for Successful
Team Building; and Successful Team Communications with 'Crucial
Conversations' "was presented by David M. Okuji, DDS, MBA, MS,
Senior Associate Director, Extramural & Special Projects, Advanced
Education in Pediatric Dentistry. Both presentations provided
participants with foundational knowledge about the successful
application of organizational culture and foundational knowledge
about team building and teamwork. Following this course, the
participants would be able to understand the fundamentals of
organizational culture as well as be able to understand a model for
teambuilding and be provided tools to participate as a contributing
member of the NYU Langone Dental Medicine Advanced Education in
Pediatric Dentistry Program.

GDE also offered dental medicine faculty CE on December 9, 2021 titled "Conservative Dentistry Using Direct Composites", presented by **Thomas M. Paumier, DDS**. Upon completion of this continuing education course, the participant will be able to: 1) Understand how to save fractured teeth with composite, 2) Determine how improvements of direct esthetic bonded composite expand treatment options in your practice, 3) Discover how to solve challenges compacted by limited available finances.

In this issue of *The Bridge*, the Research Office team members chose to highlight our new directions, projects, and partners. Over the past year, we contributed scientific writing, research and evaluation, and human participant protection expertise toward uplifting our residents and team members who care for our patients and communities. These collaborations among dedicated researchers, providers, and staff build upon and elevate earlier efforts by NYU Langone Health leaders, partners, and funding agencies and organizations to improve oral health and health care equity through patient-centered care and community-based solutions.

From the Virtual Desk of Tina C. Littlejohn, MSW Research Program Coordinator

As a part of their Program requirements, many residents are required or elect to conduct research and practice projects. In accordance with strict rules set by the US Department of Health and Human Services and NYU Langone Health, all projects that involve people must undergo self-certification by the project directors or be submitted to the NYU Grossman School of Medicine Institutional Review Board (IRB) for review and approval. I act as the liaison for the submission of research projects as required by the IRB through helping to ensure that the research is accurately executed in accordance with good clinical practice, Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) requirements, and IRB and affiliated departmental expectations. Good communication and adherence to these policies and protocols ensures that participants are treated safely and protects the rights, integrity, and confidentiality of research participants.

IMPROVING ORAL HEALTH CARE ACCESS FOR VULNERABLE PATIENTS AND COMMUNITIES DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Gary Kalkut, MD, MPH, Senior Vice President for Network
Integration, Associate Chief Clinical Officer, and Executive at NYU Langone
Health with oversight of the Department of Dental Medicine, has continued
to build a more comprehensive grants portfolio with foundation, agency,
and organizational support. With the visionary leadership of Margaret K.
Mason, DMD, MA and the hands-on contributions of Eliot George, MBA
and Lynn Gargano, DDS, the Research Office contributed grant writing and
evaluation expertise that resulted in the following awards to Family Health
Centers at NYU Langone (FHC).

Providing Dental Care to Underserved NY Children: Expanding Community- and School-Based Programs.

Funded by the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation 2020 Statewide Strategic Grants Program (FY20SSG010). Nowhere have the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Department of Dental Medicine been as severe as for Dental School Health Program, due to the closure of New York City public schools in March 2020 and in-school service suspension through August 2021. The goals of this project are to: (1) expand the capacity of FHC to provide oral health care services to children aged 0-18 years living in underserved NY communities; and (2) establish dental homes for family members of children who are patients in FHC programs.s

Integration of HIV Primary Care with Oral Health.

Funded by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) grant # P06HA45163. Through the devotion of Finn Schubert, MPH, former FHC Network HIV Site Director, and current involvement of Migdalia Vientos, Coordinator and FHC leaders across services, the goals of this project are to: (1) increase the proportion of people living with HIV (PLWH) who receive preventive dental visits and all indicated dental treatment services by improving integration of HIV primary care with oral health care through comprehensive policies and procedures and addition of dental case management services; and (2) improve oral health services for PLWH by providing comprehensive training to dental faculty, residents, and staff regarding the oral health needs of PLWH, including clinical care, cultural competence, and stigma reduction.

IMPLEMENTING, REPORTING, AND SCALING UP SUCCESSFUL PILOT STUDIES TO PROVIDE PATIENT-CENTERED CARE IN PARTNERING SITES

In September 2021, team members involved in HRSA grants #
T93HP30391 and D88HP37549 submitted the following 4 abstracts to the Bureau of Health Workforce (BHW) All Grantee and Stakeholder Virtual Meeting to be held in April 2022. Title 1 has been accepted for presentation. Titles 1 and 2 have been submitted for peer-reviewed publication. Findings will be reported in a variety of venues, including the new Improving the Quality of Patient Care Series (available at https://central.nyumc.org/lmc/site/gde/sitepages/default.aspx under the Research tab in the left navigation bar in all Program folders, along with a host of other research and practice resources). Successful pilot studies will be leveraged for additional external funding and scaled up with indicated adaptations to provide patient-centered care in partnering sites.

Title 1: Use of intra-oral cameras at chairside and a tele-mentoring protocol to detect and identify oral lesions and educate patients about oral cancer (presented by **Babak Bina, DMD** and **Mary E. Northridge, PhD, MPH**)

Title 2: Screening, referral, and follow-up of dental patients and their families for the social determinants of health to achieve health equity (presented by Raghbir Kaur, DMD, MPH, MS, Isaac P. Dapkins, MD, and Margaret K. Mason, DMD, MA)

Title 3: Integrating oral and behavioral health care screening across platforms in response to COVID-19 (presented by **Eliot George, MBA** and **Jon Marrelli, PsyD**)

Title 4: Training dental faculty in motivational interviewing to support healthful behavior change for patients and resident trainees (presented by Loreina Tam, MPA, Franzenith de la Calle, MS, RDN, and Amy Kim, DDS)



PEDIATRIC DENTISTRY PROGRAM PUBLISHES MANUSCRIPT

Abstract:

Purpose: To determine the wait time for dental treatment under general anesthesia (GA) and its impact on clinical outcomes in a pediatric population at federally qualified health centers in the United States.

Methods: Data were collected from 566 pediatric subjects who underwent dental rehabilitation under GA between July 1, 2013, and June 30, 2014. One-way analysis of variance and linear regression analyses were performed.

Results: Patients waited 110.6 days (±standard deviation: 103.9 days) between the initial and treatment visits. Regression analysis demonstrated that prolonged wait time was a significant predictor for an increased number of preoperative visits and more teeth treated than planned. Among the 25.1 percent of patients who returned for follow-up after surgery, 18.6 percent presented with pain, swelling, or broken/displaced restorations. The Canadian diagnostic code system was associated with the American Society of Anesthesiologists classification system (P<0001) and was not coincident with wait time.

Conclusion: Longer wait time was associated with continuous pain, more teeth treated than planned, and more frequent preand postoperative visits. Wait time was predictive of a higher number of preoperative visits. Initial visit pain, and extra- and intraoral swelling were associated with the Canadian diagnostic system.

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
